What is stormwater pollution?

Stormwater is the excess water from rain, snowmelt, and irrigation that doesn't absorb into the ground as surface runoff. When stormwater flows into our waterways, it can collect pollutants such as trash, harmful nutrients, and pesticides, which creates stormwater pollution. This type of pollution is significant because, unlike the water that goes down a sink or toilet in your home, stormwater is untreated and flows directly to our lakes, rivers, or ocean. Stormwater matters because it directly impacts the quality and health of our waterways for Californians and wildlife.

Pollutants of Concern

Doing your part to keep our stormwater free from source pollutants is easier than you might think. Stormwater pollution comes from streets, highways, litter, auto fluids, pet waste, and other pollutants, but many can be reduced through small actions taken around your home, yard, and business. Together, we can safeguard our water resources and the health of California's diverse communities by reducing source pollutants flowing into our local waterways. **Your actions can have a major impact!**



KEY STORMWATER POLLUTANTS AND HOW YOU CAN HELP:



SEDIMENTS are released by soil erosion and can carry other pollutants of concern into waterways. Sweep driveways instead of hosing them off, use mulch in the garden, and plant trees and shrubs.



NUTRIENTS such as nitrogen and phosphorus are generated from fertilizers and vegetation waste. Avoid over fertilizing lawns and plants, and keep fallen leaves out of storm drains.



PESTICIDES come from over application and improper disposal of chemicals.

Use organic pesticides and properly dispose of unused portions.



TRASH AND LITTER accumulate on highways and make their way into waterways. Properly secure items in truck beds and put trash and recycling into the bin.



BACTERIA comes from pet waste and illegal disposal of RV waste. Pick up after your pet, properly dispose of their waste, and use RV dumping stations.




METALS are generated by vehicle, tire, and brake wear. Regularly check tire pressure, change oil and fluids, and use commercial car washes.
